

## Bayfield Area Trails Committee Meeting Notes Tuesday December 12<sup>th</sup> @ 3 – 4:30 pm (via Zoom)

## <u>Agenda</u>

- 1. <u>Trail Naming Guidelines</u>: Kate
  - a. The guidelines were approved with the revisions listed below.
    - i. To facilitate consistency, the land manager/easement holder would vet new trail name proposals with the BAT Comm.
    - ii. Should a land manager/easement holder prefer not to name a trail, they could ask the BAT Comm. to lead the process.
    - iii. in cases where duplication may occur, it is recommended that a local identifier be assigned (e.g. Jerry Jolly or Big Ravine Overlook)
  - b. ACTION: They have been inserted into the draft Operations Manual (<u>link to manual here</u>).
- 2. Ad hoc Subcommittee Report: <u>Review Vision & Mission statements</u>
  - a. Peter gave an update on the subcommittee's process and draft Mission language and Vision concepts (per notes attached to agenda). Discussion points:
    - i. Consider dropping "the" before "Bayfield Peninsula" or "the" before "diverse habitats."
    - ii. Is "habitats" the best term? It has an ecological connotation, when diversity could encompass a broader scope (e.g. history, culture, terrain, city vs. rural)
- 3. Trails Subcommittee Report & Input from BAT Comm. (TsC) Wegerson & Ipsen
  - a. All projects completed, except signage on Pileated Woodpecker Trail.
  - Report from Ad hoc committee on <u>Trails Dedications & Forum</u> proposed for June 1 & 2, 2024 (notes attached to the agenda). Ted May gave an overview of the outline developed so far. Discussion points:
    - i. Landmark could assist with outreach and remarks on the Big Ravine
    - ii. Great to include Darren Miller at the hatchery; very knowledgeable about fish hatchery as well as history; also, he is very collaborative.
    - iii. Activities on 2 different days may be too much to ask of participants.
    - $iv.\;\;$  Perhaps ask the Blessing of the Fleet to announce the BRH dedication.
  - c. Report from Ad hoc committee on <u>Management & Maintenance Standards</u>: John Ipsen provided a concise report.
    - i. 3 members with substantial/diverse trails experience;
    - ii. Researching/reviewing existing examples from other trails systems such as the NCT, SHT, Ice Age Trail.

- iii. They will come forward with recommendations on topics such as marking trails, closures/hazards, maintenance standards, and timely communication to managers and trail users.
- d. <u>Trails Mapping</u>: Kitchell reported that a meeting was held with the County GIS/Land Records staff to continue work toward making accurate online and downloadable maps readily accessible to all trail users. This would include the potential to use a range of apps. These would be accessible/linked via the BATs website. This coordination is a work in progress.
- 4. Communications & Website: Kitchell
  - a. Neil Howk is taking the lead on interpretive and orientation signs for Salmo & PWT Trailheads: coordinating with Ted May & Darren Miller @ the hatchery.
  - b. Adding PWT & Big Ravine Headwaters Trails to the website trails page & maps
  - c. Annual Report: Kitchell
    - i. Wait until after Jan. 1 to distribute, due to inundation of donation requests before year's end.
    - ii. Add narrative in the first section to explain the BAT Comm. structure
    - iii. ACTION: Circulate to BAT Comm. review & comment by 1<sup>st</sup> week of January
    - iv. Discussion points: ACTION: Kitchell will incorporate these into revised report.
      - 1. 2023: Don't forget to include upgraded signs on the Brownstone Trail
      - 2. Concerns that the funding pie chart may be misleading/confusing.
      - 3. In Funding Section: Suggest adding more narrative about the land and trails ownership by each partner.
        - a. Explain the scope of the funding being displayed in the table
      - 4. 2024 Priorities:
        - a. Landmark will provide suggested language for the Brownstone Trail.
        - b. County asked to drop the link between the Jerry Jolly Overlook and the Jolly Long Loop; change Fire Hill language to" assist Bayfield County on planning & implementation"
      - 5. Last section: add an opportunity to "Donate Here," accompanied by explanation about how the fiscal sponsorship works and that donations will be used for priority projects selected by the BAT Committee.
      - 6. Fred Clark asked if there is a way to reach trail users at trailheads for fundraising and volunteering.
      - 7. ACTION: This will be placed on a future agenda as a focus topic.
  - d. Pileated Woodpecker Trail blog planned for when snowshoe season begins
- 5. Economic Impact Study Update: Kitchell
  - **a.** Received notice last week that funding approval is underway. Stay tuned.

  - $iv.\;\;$  Asking AWB to groom the Jerry Jolly Trail to Star Route
- f. Town of Bell/Cornucopia Trails Club: (Rothe):
  - i. A local resident hiked & mapped 250 miles on and around Pratt's Peak and documented very interesting resources, including trail routes and multitiered beaver ponds. Only one person encountered. Would like to revisit potential trails with the County.
  - ii. Lindley expressed that trails on Pratt's Peak are not a County priority.
- g. Town of Bayfield: (Kitchell)
  - i. All projects complete, except Pileated Woodpecker
    - 1. Directional signage, to be installed when delivered
    - 2. Working on map to be installed at key intersections. Kitchell will work with County GIS/Land Records on a map and share it for review with BAT Comm. members to consider developing common look & feel.
- h. **Red Cliff** (Huinker): Trails Feasibility Study: 4 contractors have been in contact with Ashley. Proposals are due 12/15. The goal is to review proposals then select a contractor and obligate funds by the end of February.
  - i. Ashley's supervisor resigned; Ashley is acting in charge of fisheries & wildlife group.
